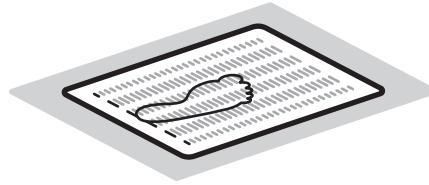

A4 MEASURING CHART GUIDE

Before you measure



Make sure your printer is set to 100% or 'do not scale' to print the A4 measuring chart to the right dimensions.



Place the chart on a hard surface to keep things accurate.

Time to size up



Measure both feet, one foot is usually larger than the other. Note the number above the child's toes. If they are just sitting over a UK2, and under a UK3 - although it may be slightly

closer to the UK2 - always go with the size above, as this allows growing room.

Ensure heels touch the thicker line at the edge of the chart.

Always remember...



FLAT FEET

Is the child standing up straight and looking ahead?

Are the feet flat to the chart? You must ensure you flatten their foot as some children tend to curl their toes.



Ensure you take the measurement from the longest toe - this is not always the big toe.



If the shoes are sandals, measure with bare feet for an accurate reading.



If the socks are crumpled it will add length to the foot, if it is pulled too tight it will constrict the foot making it appear shorter.



If the child is wearing trousers, roll them up as this could affect the positioning of the foot and give an incorrect reading.
